Leprosy Terror Back Again

While India celebrate its near victory over polio another dreaded disease "leprosy" begins its haunt. According to a target set by the World Health Organisation (WHO), countries can 'eliminate leprosy' when there are fewer than one case for every 10,000 people. Official records says leprosy has been eliminated in India in 2005 but now 10 years on reality states quite the opposite, fresh cases continue to emerge 1,30,000 indians are diagnosed with leprosy every year more than every other country put together.

"Leprosy" when you hear the term it probably contain image of people who suffer from great facial deformity or have limbs that are damaged by the disease, that many believe existed thousand of years ago but unfortunately the sad reality is that hundred of thousand of people across the globe are still affected by this disease. A disease that only cause excessive physical pain and discomfort but also results in isolation by the very society that once embraced these people.

Leprosy also known as Hansen's disease is a chronic infectious disease caused by Mycobacterium leprae. It usually affects the skin and peripheral nerves in the arms and legs. The disease is characterized by long incubation period generally 5-7 years. Symptoms that develop include formation of tumor consisting of a mass of granular tissue of the nerves, respiratory tract, skin and eyes. This may result in a lack of ability to feel pain and thus loss of part of extremities due to repeated injuries or infection due to unnoticed wounds. Weakness and poor eyesight may also be present. Leprosy is a leading cause of permanent physical disability. However leprosy is actually not that contagious. One can catch it only if one come into close and repeated contact with nose and mouth droplets from someone with untreated leprosy. Children are more likely to get leprosy than adults.

Talking about the present scenario of India, a total of 127000 new cases were detected during 2013-2014. As per World Health Organisation (WHO), 65% of all new cases of leprosy globally are from india. Sadly today the leprosy is not in safe hands. After declaration of leprosy elimination & merging its services with other health problems in 2005. Govt. has pulled out all the scemes related to the aid of the leprosy patient The special dealing with the disease has been diminished. Now the cases are seen by general doctors, who are not specialist in leprosy.

As leprosy is a complex disease, a specialist staff is must to treat the cases differently. It hurts patients mentally, physically & socially so staff dealing with the disease must have deep understanding about the patients mental & social problems. Integration is also must, as it reduces the stigma associated with leprosy. The health-care activities of treating and preventing disabilities need to be provided in an integrated setting with a councilor & physiotherapist.

KOBE BRYANT TO RETIRE

"My heart can take the pounding, my mind can handle the grind, but my body knows it's time to say goodbye" wrote five time NBA champion Kobe Bryant as he poetically announced his intention to retire at the end of the season. During a 20 Year career with the LA Lakers, the 37 year old Kobe Bryant has scored 32683 points, though in recent seasons his form was hindered by his injury.

Bryant signaled his plan to retire in a poem on the Players Tribune website, later telling the media he felt "at peace" with his decision and "excited for what's to come". Ranked 3rd on the NBA's all-timescorers list, the two time Olympic gold medalist averaged more than 25 games in his 1293 NBA games.

This news has been spreading like wildfire and people have started giving tributes to the legend. After all the dedication and the hard work it seems like Kobe Bryant's body cannot take the mental or the physical stress anymore.

Kobe planned on retiring after playing his last game against the Miami Heats but apparently he'll playing his last game against the Utah Jazz on April 13 i.e. The end of the season 2015-16. Kobe and his team will march through the farewell tour with lowest of expectations. But the real question is what will the Lakers do without Kobe?

It seems that the Lakers lineup without Kobe is a more efficient offensive unit thus making the team just as strong as it was with Kobe. But the major drawback is that the



team will be much slower without Kobe on the court.

"There's so much beauty in the pain of this thing," Bryant said. "It sounds really weird to say that, but I appreciate the really, really tough times as much as I appreciated the great times. It's important to go through that progression, because I think that's where you learn about the self"

Players like LeBron James, Dwayne Wade, Stephen Curry, Dirk Nowitsky and many more have been paying a tribute to the legend and bidding goodbyes in their own ways. It's finally time to say goodbye to one of the best basketball players this world has ever seen or probably will ever see.

PEACE AT DANGER: Rescue Work In Process

There were seven coordinated terror attacks in Paris carried out by terrorists, killing at least 130 people. The first attacks were launched virtually simultaneously, with two explosions close to the Stade de France a little after 9.20pm according to local time, four miles apart. From there, the terrorists drove around a mile south-east apparently past the area of the Bataclan concert venue to then launch another attack, this time on La Belle Equipe bar in Rue de Charonne. At least 19 people died after the terrace was shelled with bullets at around 9.35pm. The next attack, at the Bataclan concert venue in Boulevard Voltaire, was deadliest. There atleast 89 people lost their lives when they were shot by gunmen wielding AK-47s and wearing suicide vests. The attackers stormed into the hall and fired ruthlessly at hundreds of screaming concert-goers, who were watching the US rock group Eagles of Death Metal playing to a full house of 1,500 people.

The attackers opened fire on the Petit Cambodge Cambodian restaurant in Rue Bichat, and the Le Carillon bar on the other side of the road. With devastating brutality they gunned down diners and revellers at the two venues, killing 15 people as they were enjoying their Friday night out.

They began a siege that lasted two hours and forty minutes. Two of the terrorists blew up their explosive belts as heavily armed anti-terror police ended the siege at around 12.30am and third was shot by officers. Terrifying details have emerged of the police assault on the terrorist attacks.

20 minutes past midnight the order was passed to start the final assault. The police burst open the door, protected by a heavy metal shield and advanced down the corridor that was found to be full of about 20 hostages.

The attackers opened fire immediately but the police unit kept advancing, with officers rushing screaming hostages out as they went forward.

When finally they were face to face with the attackers, the police threw a stun grenade as they blasted their guns at the terrorists. One attacker went down, and

then the other detonated his suicide vest, blowing both their bodies to pieces. The assault lasted three minutes.

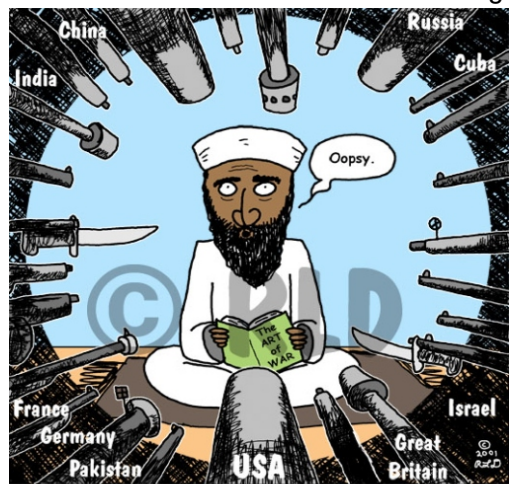
At around 9.50pm a third blast took place near the Stade de France, this time by a McDonald's restaurant on the fringes of the stadium. The blast terrorized spectators who were already trying to flee the stadium following the first two explosions. The match had continued, with many attributing the initial noises to fireworks, but word soon spread of what had taken place outside the stadium, as people read updates on their mobile phones. At least 130 people have died, according to city



Officials, with many still in intensive care. At least 89 people were killed in the concert hall. Three assailants were also killed after police stormed in - two by activating their suicide vests and a third

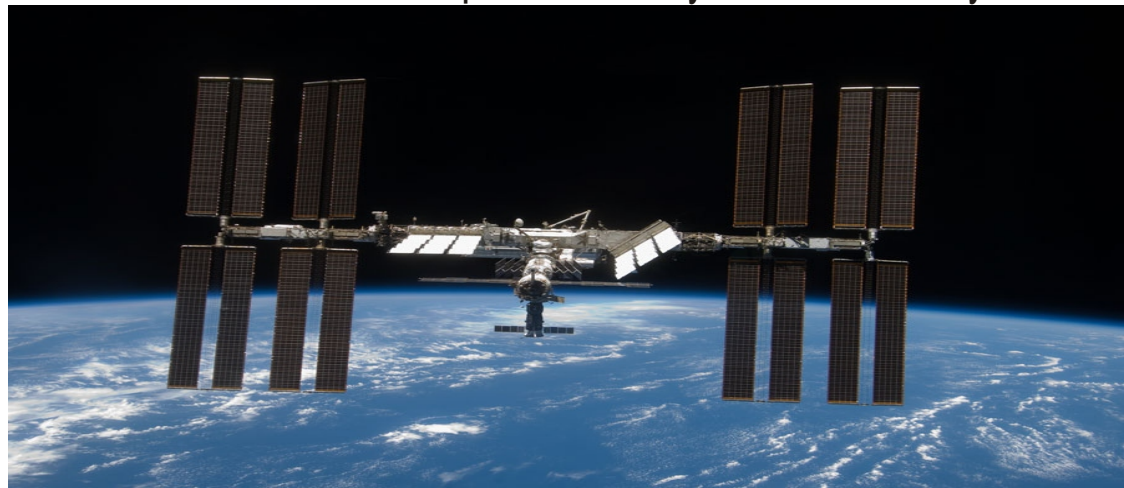
shot dead. Mr Hollande, who had to be evacuated from the stadium when the bombs went off outside, said in a televised address that the nation would stand firm and united. "This is a terrible ordeal that again assails us," he said. "We know where it comes from, who these criminals are, who these terrorists are." Indian Prime minister Narendra Modi said, "Both our country face extreme threats from terrorism that is why fighting terrorism is not something that just one or two or three countries can do. This is the responsibility of every human that's in the world, every humanitarian, every human being.

NASA mission with 7,000 pounds of key science on way to ISS.

Carrying 7,000 pounds of research materials that will directly support over dozens of key investigations on the orbiting laboratory, a cargo-laden Orbital ATK Cygnus spacecraft soared towards the ISS

Aburst of smoke and column of flame on Sunday trailed a United Launch Alliance Atlas V rocket as it powered the cargo mission from the Cape Canaveral Air Force Station in Florida onto an orbital path to rendezvous with the International Space Station in three days.

The mission will deliver experiments, equipments and supplies to the orbiting laboratory and its six-member crew of astronauts and cosmonauts, the US space agency, NASA, said in a statement.

"We are looking forward to getting more science facilities and numerous research investigations. There are 324 investigations during this increment pair. It's important to have a regular cadence of resupply flights, and we are looking forward to regular resupply to use the station as intended," said Kirk Shireman, NASA's programme manager of the ISS.

This is the first flight in a series that will include a crew change in addition to a Russian progress cargo craft leaving and another one coming to the station.

In the near future, Boeing and United Launch Alliance plan to use the Atlas V to launch astronauts to the station in the CST-100 Starliner for NASA's Commercial Crew Programme.

SpaceX is preparing its own spacecraft combination - Falcon 9 and Crew Dragon - to carry astronauts to the station in the near future.

"The crew members need these critical supplies from the Earth to do their important work and we intend to do everything possible to enable their mission to continue," added Frank Culbertson, president of Orbital ATK's Space Systems Group and a former astronaut. Cygnus will be grappled on December 9 by NASA astronaut Kjell Lindgren, using the space station's robotic arm to take hold of the spacecraft.

The spacecraft will spend more than a month attached to the space station before its destructive re-entry into the Earth's atmosphere, disposing of about 3,000 pounds of trash.

Much of the scientific cargo will be used in research by the station astronauts.

With the new supplies aboard the station, the crew will install the laboratory equipment including a new life science facility that will allow studies on cell cultures, bacteria and other microorganisms.

The astronauts will conduct experiments to survey the behaviour of gases and liquids and clarify the properties of molten steel in weightlessness.

The station's current crew, known as Expeditions 45 and 46, will conduct more than 250 science and research efforts during its mission

Cargo carried to space on this mission includes payloads that were lost on two previous failed cargo missions

Several teams of students ranging from elementary school age to university level also have a particular interest in this launch because their CubeSats are tucked inside a NanoRacks carrier for deployment from the station

CubeSats are small, inexpensive spacecraft built in standardised 4.5-inch-cubed units.

Students typically use the sophisticated craft to gain hands-on experience in electronics and design

Private companies were exploring the opportunities of launching versatile but simple spacecraft that could be used in groups for everything from establishing rapid communication links to weather forecasting. The spacecraft will remain connected to the station through most of January as astronauts first unpack the new gear and then load some 3,000 pounds of used and unneeded equipment into the Cygnus along with trash

It will all burn up in the Earth's atmosphere after the Cygnus is released from the station. "NASA is delighted at the continued progress made possible by our investment in commercial space," noted NASA deputy administrator Dava Newman.

Reverent tribute to B.R. Ambedkar

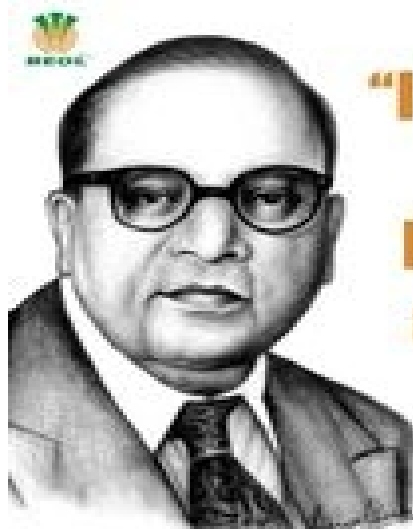

Dr. B.R. Ambedkar was paid tributes by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, President Pranab Mukherjee and Vice President Hamid Ansari. The day has given the name of 'Mahaparinirvan Diwas'. Many prominent personalities remembered Babasaheb Bhim Rao Ambedkar on his 60th death anniversary.

Pranab Mukherjee, Hamid Ansari and Narendra Modi granted blooming tributes at the Dalit icon's statue in the parliament house lawn. Later, the Prime Minister offered dedicatory of two coins one of Rs 125 and other Rs 10 denomination at his residence as part of the 125th birth anniversary

year celebration of Ambedkar. Thousands of followers of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar dedicated a tribute in different cities. In Mumbai it took place at his memorial 'chaitybhoomi' in the Dadar area as many of his followers gathered there.

Vidyasagar Rao and Chief Minister Devendra Fadnis were among those who paid tributes to the Dalit icon. The Prime Minister called him visionary and profound thinker and said "His economic thoughts and visions were not clearly understood and needed to be appreciated even though his social struggle have been recognised." Our government is leaving no stone unturned to fulfil his vision and dreams to create a prosperous and inclusive India" said Modi after the function in which Finance Minister Arun Jaitley, Social Justice and Empowerment

BJP leader L.K Advani former Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh and congress Vice President Rahul Gandhi also gave homage at the statue of Ambedkar at the Parliament house lawn. Prime Minister Narendra Modi tweeted that "Babasaheb is an apostle of equality and social harmony. He emerged as a ray of hope for the marginalized and the oppressed giving a powerful voice to their suffering. His contribution in the making of our constitution will be eternally remembered".

"All the parties contributed the two special days to discuss commitment to the constitution as part of the 125th birth anniversary celebration of doctor BR Ambedkar" said Parliamentary Affairs Minister Venkaiah Naidu on Wednesday. There will be no zero hour on Thursday and Friday said Lok Sabha bulletin. Our constitution is a ray of hope "H-harmony, O-opportunity, P-participation, E-equality" said Prime Minister Narendra Modi and requested opposition to allow parliament to

function this time.

On Wednesday evening, Prime Minister Narendra Modi tweeted Parliament house picture. Mr. Naidu said "Vice president Hamid Ansari the Chairman of Rajya Sabha and Lok Sabha speaker Sumitra Mahajan will make opening remarks in the two houses, following which Home Minister Rajnath Singh also the deputy leader of Lok Sabha, will control a discussion in the lower house. Rajya Sabha discussion will be initiated by finance minister and leader of house Arun Jaitley.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will step towards the end of the discussion in houses. 26th November the day the constitution was completed, would be celebrated grandly in the schools across the country with the name of Samvidhan Diwas. "If we call Ambedkar as belonging to dalits in the absence of a long term vision it will be great injustice to him. He belonged to everyone" said Narendra Modi. Modi said his government had planned to develop and preserve five landmarks in Dr Ambedkar's life referring to them as "Panchteerth".

Chennai flood death toll rises to 280

Suraj Malik India's fourth-largest city, help the rescue effort.

Rains eased in the flood-hit city of Chennai in southern India on Friday, raising hopes that rescue efforts could pick up, after the death of 18 patients at a private hospital added to the official toll of 280 confirmed killed in the disaster.

The commercial airport of Chennai will also be partly opened on Saturday after being shut for the past three days, which should help move workers and relief materials badly needed in the city of six million. Flood waters that had started to recede began rising again around noon after a new cloudburst that sent residents running for shelter under trees and in shop fronts. Parts of the flat, coastal city remained under as much as eight feet (2.5 meters) of water for fourth day. Many residents have spent days stranded on rooftops since more than 345 mm (14 inches) of rain fell over 24 hours on Dec. 1, the most since the British ruled the city in Tamil Nadu state, then known as Madras, 100 years ago.



Despite combined rescue efforts by the military and civilian emergency services, help yet to reach many areas. Residents were angered by reports that authorities had released water from brimming lakes without much warning. The Military helicopters dropped food to residents stranded on rooftops and the ministry doubled to 4,000 number of soldiers deployed to relief flights.

Chennai has boomed in the 21st century as a center for vehicle factories and IT outsourcing. But Tamil Nadu officials defended trash-filled drains and building on lake beds in the rush to industrialization and prosperity logged headquarters on Friday evening. They said authorities have so far evacuated 127,580 people. More than half of them from banks of rivers are now sheltered in relief camps and are being treated for fever and infections to prevent an epidemic. The Tamil Nadu public works department said it did issue warnings, but the information apparently did not reach the public because of a breakdown in media and phone communications. The Chennai edition of The Hindu newspaper did not go to press on Thursday, apparently for the first time in 137 years. The government restored some commercial flights to a naval air base near the city, and the Airports Authority of India said the Chennai airport would be open for day-time operations for relief flights.

SALMAN KHAN VERDICT: ACQUITTED OF ALL CHARGES

Salman Khan has been acquitted of all 2002 hit and run charges by the Bombay High Court on December 10, 2015. The court came with the verdict when they observed that the prosecution failed to build a case against Salman.

The prosecution was unable to build up a case against him due to lack of proper evidence. The procedure of connecting all the evidence with regard to biological evidence against him was faulty in manner, said the Court. Also, the Court said that the prosecution was unable to convince them that Salman Khan was behind the wheels that day or if there was any consumption of alcohol. The testimony of the only witness, Salman Khan's bodyguard, Ravindra Patil was disregarded. The court declared him as an unreliable witness and said that the session courts had made a mistake by relying on his statement. According to Justice A.R. Joshi,

India stands firmly with the great people of France in dealing with this tragedy. And we must stand together as humanity

in combating the major global threat of our times and to uphold our values and our way of life." Earlier on Friday, two explosions were heard outside the Stade de France stadium north of Paris during a France-Germany friendly football match. A police union official said there were two suicide attacks and a bombing that killed at least three people. The attacks came as France had heightened security measures ahead of a major global climate conference that starts in two weeks, out of fear of violent protests and potential terrorist attacks.
